**Project Location:** The project includes replacement and/or rehabilitation of existing drainage systems located on State Route (SR) 254 from post miles (PMs) 4.36 to 4.62 in Humboldt County at approximately Lat/Long 40.2220, -123.80698.

**Project Description:** The road and slope at PM 4.5 would be stabilized with a 396-foot-long soldier pile ground anchor (SPGA) wall. The southbound shoulder adjacent to the wall would be reconstructed and widened to 8 feet while the northbound shoulder will be perpetuated. Additionally, the northbound and southbound travel lanes would be widened to 12 feet to meet current standards. The drainage system at PM 4.49 would be replaced on the same alignment. The existing drainage inlet and 70-foot-long, 18-inch-diameter corrugated steel pipe culvert would be replaced with a 70-foot-long, 30-inch-diameter corrugated steel pipe cross culvert would be replaced with a 70-foot-long, 30-inch-diameter corrugated steel pipe culvert. Approximately 19 feet of the stream would be daylighted. Rock slope protection would be placed at the outlet, approximately 15.5-feet long and 8 feet wide, with gravel filter placed between the RSP and the underlying soil to allow passage of water and to retain fine soil particles.
