Project Location: The project is located at a private reservoir immediately upstream of the Bear Canyon Creek dam at 1460 Niebaum Lane in Rutherford, Napa County, California. The reservoir is located west of the winery building, approximately 0.68 miles, and can be accessed via the winery's unpaved access road to Bear Canyon Creek; Latitude 38.45181°, Longitude -122.44416°

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement number 1600-2020-0275-R3, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Niebaum-Coppola Estate Winery, L.P.

Project activities are limited to routine maintenance of the on-stream Bear Canyon Creek reservoir (Reservoir) and associated fish passage structures. Routine maintenance activities include: 1) draining the Reservoir and removing up to 2,800 cubic yards of accumulated sediment from the Reservoir and around the outlet pipe annually, or on an as needed basis, to maintain functioning fish passage structures; 2) maintaining and repairing existing stream gauges, and 3) temporarily stockpiling excavated sediment at upland locations on the Niebaum-Coppola Estate Winery, L.P. property.
