The purpose of the project is to improve the pedestrian accessibility for persons with disability in compliance with the Department's current ADA standards.

General

Air Quality

The project is exempt from all project-level conformity requirements per Table 2 of 40 CFR 93.126 under the project type "Pedestrian facilities".

Biological Resources

A preconstruction survey for migratory birds and raptors will be required fourteen (14) days prior to start of construction, if construction activities occur within the migratory bird nesting season (February 1- September 30).

If migratory birds or raptors are found nesting within or next to a work area during construction activities, the following Environmentally Sensitive Area (ESA) buffers must be implemented and avoided, until the young have fledged or a qualified biologist determines that construction may proceed.

- For active migratory bird nests: 100-foot ESA buffer.
- For active burrowing owl burrows: 165-foot ESA buffer (for Sept 1 Jan 31 non-breeding period) and 250-foot ESA buffer (for Feb 1 Aug 31 breeding period).
- For active raptor nests: 300-foot ESA buffer.
- For active Swainson's hawk nests: 600-foot ESA buffer.

Environmental Justice

The project build alternative will not cause disproportionately high and adverse effects on any minority or low-income populations in accordance with the provisions of EO 12898. No further environmental justice analysis is required.

Hazardous Materials and Waste

There is potential to encounter non-hazardous concentrations of Aerially Deposited Lead (ADL) while working in unpaved areas within the project limits.

The Caltrans Standard Special Provision, 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii), which pertains to Earth Material Containing Lead, shall be added to the construction contract. A lead compliance plan prepared by a Certified Industrial Hygienist (CIH) is required.

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
