Project Title: Brown (Avicenna Land Holdings LLC) Stream Crossings and Water Diversions (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. EPIMS-HUM-13666-R1)

Project Location: The project is located within the Mattole River watershed, approximately 2 miles southeast of the community of Petrolia, County of Humboldt, State of California; Sections 11 and 12, T02 South, R02 West, Humboldt Base and Meridian, in the Petrolia and Buckeye Mountain U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangles; Assessor's Parcel Numbers 105-111-007 and 105-121-003; latitude 40.3123 and longitude 124.2537 at the first point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The project is limited to 9 encroachments (Table 1). Two encroachments are for water diversion from unnamed tributaries to Mattole River. Water is diverted for domestic use to service three houses and a bunkhouse for 14 full time residents. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. The 7 other proposed encroachments are to upgrade failing and undersized stream crossings. Work for these encroachments will include excavation, removal of the failing crossings, replacement with new properly sized crossings, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
