General:

- Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact the Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.
- Contact the Environmental Office to attend the pre-construction meeting.

Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 - 1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
 - 2. Protect the discovery area
 - 3. Notify the Engineer
 - 4. The Department Investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.
- Location 1 (PM 21.46) and Location 2 (PM 23.60) will require Archaeological Monitoring during all construction related activities. Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-2.03B shall be included in the construction contract.

Hazardous Waste:

• Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) regarding a Lead Compliance Plan shall be included in the construction contract.

Biology:

 If construction will occur during bird nesting season (February 1 through September 30), contact the Environmental Office at least one month prior to the start of construction to schedule a pre-construction bird survey. Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A regarding protective buffer radii shall be included in the construction contract. If an active migratory bird nest is observed, a 100-foot protective buffer will be established around the nest until

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the young have fledged. For hawks, a 300-foot buffer will be established. For Swainson's hawk, a 600-foot buffer will be established.

• At Location 2 (PM 23.60) there is a sensitive wetland habitat near the culvert inlet. This sensitive area will be flagged by a Caltrans qualified biologist prior to the start of any construction activities. No heavy equipment will be allowed within the flagged area. The contractor must contact the District 10 (D10) Environmental Office thirty (30) days prior to the start of construction to schedule the flag installation. No construction activities are permitted within the flagged area unless authorized by the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office. A Caltrans biologist must give approval of work prior to ground disturbance at Location 2 (CAL-26-23.60) and may monitor construction activities as deemed appropriate by the Caltrans Biologist. Include Caltrans SSP 14-6.03A in the construction contract.
