Purpose: The purpose of the project is to dissuade individuals experiencing homelessness from frequenting the location in order to reduce the health and safety risk to the general public, and Caltrans staff during cleanup activities.

Need: The project is needed because the location requires constant cleanup of litter and is posing a health and safety risk due to the resulting damage to the bridge components of the structure and the risk Caltrans staff members experience during cleanup activities.

Right-of-Way

Acquisitions or TCEs were not needed for this project due to work being confined to Caltrans Right of Way.

Staging/Stockpiling

Staging occurred along Interstate 5 within Caltrans Right of Way.

Disposal/Borrow Sites

No borrow sites were required for this project. Any excess material that was generated became the property of the contractor.

Biological Resources

The project area is highly disturbed and no biological resources are present under the bridge. Concreted rock slope protection was placed above the Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM) to avoid any potential impacts to the Sacramento River.

Utilities

All utilities in proximity to the location of work were protected in place.
