

Project Title: Lewiston Community Center Siding Replacement Project		
Project Location: The proposed project is located within the unincorporated community of Lewiston in Trinity County. The community is approximately 16 miles southeast of Weaverville and approximately 35 miles west of Redding. The project is located in Section 19, Township 33N, Range 8 W, of the U.S. Geological Survey's (USGS) Lewiston 7.5-minute quadrangle, as shown in Figure 1. The project site consists of the Lewiston Community Center building, located at 302 Texas Avenue. The building is on Trinity County Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 025-580-033.		
City:	Lewiston (unincorporated)	County: Trinity
Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project: The Lewiston Community Services District (LCSD) owns and maintains the Lewiston Community Center. The Center serves as the District office and central location for community meetings and events. The building was constructed in the 1950's and the exterior siding consists of the original asbestos shingles. While the building has been maintained over the years, new siding is needed to encapsulate the asbestos to protect the public and improve the aesthetic value of the building. The exterior steps on the north, east, and west sides of the building are also in need of replacement due to age and weather damage.		
The proposed project would install new steps and siding on the existing building; the siding would be a similar color to the existing building. Work would be undertaken in accordance with local building code requirements, and would not disturb the existing asbestos shingles.

Exempt Status, Ministerial Exemptions:		
§15268 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 6, Chapter 3 (Ministerial Exemption)		
Reason Why Project Is Exempt: §15268 of the CCR states that ministerial projects are exempt from the requirements of CEQA. As defined in §15369 of the CCR, a ministerial project is one that requires only conformance with a fixed standard or objective measurement and requires little or no personal judgment by a public official as to the wisdom or manner of carrying out the project. Generally, ministerial permits require a public official to determine only that the project conforms with applicable zoning and building code requirements. The proposed Community Center siding replacement does not require discretionary review by Trinity County or other public agency; therefore, the project is ministerially exempt.
