Present Land Use/Zoning/General Plan Designation

City of Calimesa General Plan and Riverside County land use designation within and adjacent to the project site include Specific Plan Area 1, Regional Commercial, Residential Low, Residential Rural, Business Park, Light Industrial, Open Space Recreation Light Industrial, Commercial Retail, Very Low Density Residential, Residential Low Medium, and Commercial Neighborhood.

City of Calimesa and Riverside County Zoning Designations within and adjacent to the project site include Specific Plan Area 1, Regional Commercial, Residential Low/ Medium, Industrial Park, Controlled Development Area, Scenic Highway Commercial, Residential Agricultural, Industrial Park, and Residential Low / Medium.

Project Description

The City of Calimesa (City), in cooperation with the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) and the County of Riverside (County), proposes to upgrade and reconfigure the existing Interstate 10 (I-10)/Cherry Valley Boulevard Interchange. The project is located on I-10, between the Singleton Road and Oak Valley Parkway interchanges. Three alternatives are being evaluated: Alternative 1 (No Build), Alternative 3 (Diverging Diamond Interchange), Alternative 4 (Partial Cloverleaf Interchange). Key components of the project would include the widening of Cherry Valley Boulevard (including the I-10 overcrossing), realignment and reconstruction of on- and off-ramps, auxiliary lanes along I-10 in both the eastbound and westbound directions, and provisions for sidewalks and bicycle facilities along Cherry Valley Boulevard.
