Biological - During the field investigation, western Joshua trees (Yucca brevifolia) were observed mainly in the upper elevations to the west and southwest of the current Black Mountain Quarry. No Joshua trees were located in the Ballast Quarry area and only isolated trees were found in the southern areas or the current White Mountain Quarry area. Impacts to Joshua trees will be avoided to the maximum extent possible.
Mitigation Measure BIO-1: If any western Joshua trees (Yucca brevifolia) will be impacted by future mining activities during the status review or if formally listed, compliance with California Endangered Species Act (CESA) will be required and an Individual Take Permit (ITP) with CDFW will need to be prepared and processed with applicable mitigation and compensation implemented.
