Cultural:

- If cultural materials are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 - 1. Stop all work within a 60foot radius of discovery
 - 2. Protect the discovery area
 - 3. Notify the Engineer
 - 4. The Department Investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archaeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County coroner contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. If the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) who will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At the same time the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Biology

• If construction occurs during migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), a preconstruction bird survey will be completed by a Caltrans qualified biologist within 14 days prior to the start of any construction related activities. Contact the Environmental office 30 days prior to the start of construction to schedule the survey. If an active nest is discovered, a 100-foot protective buffer will be established around it. If an active hawk nest is discovered, a 300-foot protective buffer will be required. If an active Swainson's hawk nest is discovered, a 600-foot protective buffer will be required. No construction related activities will occur within the protective buffer limits until the young have fledged. If work does not commence within 14 days of the preconstruction bird survey clearance, or if work halts for more than 14 days, a subsequent bird survey will be required prior to the commencement or recommencement of any construction related activities. Include Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A in the contract.
