Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The Arco AM/PM Service Station project proposes to develop a 2.4-acre portion of a 6.9-acre site with a 6,323-square foot retail building that includes 5,123-square foot food market with office and storage in a mezzanine level and an adjacent 1,200-square foot retail tenant space, fueling stations gasoline and diesel dispensing within the Highway Office/Commercial (HO/C) District.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The project has potentially significant effects under the categories of Biological Resources and Geology. The following Mitigation Measures are required in order to reduce potential impacts to less than significant: 1) a pre-construction survey for burrowing owl(s), 2) the purchase of 0.21-acre of re-establishment credits and 0.21-acre of rehabilitation credits from the Riverpark Mitigation Bank, and 3) the participation of a qualified paleontologist will be retained, and that the paleontologist shall be present during all grading and other significant ground-disturbing activities that reach more than 10 feet below existing surface grade.

Additionally, while not required to reduce an impact, but instead as an additional pre-caution, six mitigation measures requiring the participation of tribal monitors during grading and the preparation of a Cultural Resource Management Plan have been included under the category of Cultural Resources.
