Project Title: Keswick Gravel Injection 2022 Project

<u>Project Location - Specific</u>: Keswick Dam Road Assessor's Parcel Number: 065-240-012-000 Latitude: 40.609016° and Longitude: -122.446498°

Project Location - County: Shasta County

Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Project consists of importing fish spawning gravel, dumping it near the edge of an embankment more than 100 feet above the river, and then pushing it into the river where it will naturally migrate downstream and replenish spawning areas. Gravel injections serve to replace spawning gravel in the river system that is no longer naturally available due to Shasta and Keswick Dam. The Project will import approximately 20,000 tons of washed, clean spawning gravel over a period of three weeks in a location historically utilized for this purpose. During high flow events and releases, the gravel will naturally wash downstream and replenish the spawning gravel in areas where fish spawn, like Redding Riffle and Turtle Bay. This is an annual or bi-annual project conducted under the Central Valley Project Improvement Act and funded by the Bureau of Reclamation.

Exempt Status:

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, Central Valley Region has determined that the Project is categorically exempt from review under CEQA pursuant to California Code of Regulations, title 14, article 19, section 15333, Small Habitat Restoration. Class 33 consists of projects not to exceed five acres in size to assure the maintenance, restoration, enhancement, or protection of habitat for fish, plants, or wildlife provided that: (a) there would be no significant adverse impact on endangered, rare or threatened species or their habitat pursuant to section 15065; (b) there are no hazardous materials at or around the project site that may be disturbed or removed; and (c) the project will not result in impacts that are significant when viewed in connection with the effects of past projects, the effects of other current projects, and the effects of probable future projects.

Reasons why Project is Exempt:

This project is Categorically Exempt under CEQA section 15333 because the project's sole purpose is spawning habitat restoration and is less than 5 acres in size.
