Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The project consists of the demolition of an existing 1,312 sq. ft., one-story, single-family residence with an attached garage, and the construction of a 2,590 sq. ft., two-story, single-fmily residence with an attached two car garage and 750 sq. ft. of outdoor use area. The proposed height is 24'10". No trees are proposed for removal. The proposed devlopment will fully utilize the Local Coastal Plan's (LCP) allowed primary coverage area of 15%, as well as the allowed 750 sq. ft. outdoor use area. The site is located in the Coastal Zone, the Asilomar Dunes Residential Area (ARDA) which includes area identified in the City's certified Local Coastal Plan as Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Area (ESHA), and Archaeological Zone. As required by the LCP's Implementation Plan (IP), the application includes a Biological Assessment and Habitat Restoration Plan, a Phase I Archaeological Report, and a Phase I Historic Report which found the existing home to be ineligible for the Historic Resources Inventory. The conclusions and recommendations of these reports have been included as mitigation measures and conditions of approval as appropriate.
