Project Location: The Project will occur within the Chowchilla and Fresno Rivers, Ash and Berenda Sloughs, and Dry Creek, in central and western Madera County, California. In the Chowchilla River, Ash Slough, and Berenda Slough, the Project spans from the diversion structure upstream and east of the City of Chowchilla, westward to the Eastside Bypass Canal. The Project in Dry Creek spans from the Madera Canal and confluence of Daulton Creek approximately five miles northeast of the community of Madera Acres, westward to the Fresno River at Road 16. The Project in the Fresno River spans from the railroad crossing near Raymond Road (Road 28 1/2) and Highway 145 east of the City of Madera, westward to the Eastside Bypass Canal.
