The project site consists of an approximate Number 015-126-010) in the City of South	ly 1.63-acre parcel located at 40 Airport Boulevard (Assessor's Parcel San Francisco, California.
The 40 Airport Blvd Project (proposed project) would include the demolition of the existing building and subsequent redevelopment of the project site with one eight-story apartment building with 292 multi-family residential units. In addition, the proposed building would include 308 parking stalls on two levels of podium parking, approximately 17,566 square feet (sf) of amenity space, and associated improvements. Implementation of the proposed project would require City approval of a General Plan Amendment, Specific Plan Amendment, Zoning Map Amendment, Transportation Demand Management Plan, and Site Plan – Design Review.

The Sustainable Communities Environmental Assessment Initial Study (SCEA IS) identifies potentially significant project-specific impacts for the following issue areas: Air Quality, Biological Resources, Geology and Soils, Hazards and Hazardous Materials, and Transportation.

However, the SCEA IS includes project-specific mitigation measures to reduce all potentially significant impacts to less-than-significant levels. For example, the mitigation measures require the following: incorporation of appropriate indoor air filters; an evaluation to identify naturally-occurring asbestos; pre-construction surveys for protected wildlife species; and preparation of a geotechnical exploration and incorporation of all identified geotechnical recommendations into project design.

The City of South San Francisco has not yet received comments on the proposed project that raise issues or areas of controversy. However, typical concerns related to development within the City include:
