Thank you for including the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in the environmental review process for the above referenced ND. Conditional Use Permit for a new adult day care center within an existing tenant space at an existing commercial complex. The County of Los Angeles is the Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The project site is approximately 2/3 of a mile east of State Route 60 (SR-60). The Initial Study states that the project will have no impact on transportation. We do not anticipate any potential safety impact from the proposed project to our State facility (SR-60). However, we would like to be informed of any additional impacts to our facilities should it occur. The following information is included for your consideration. We encourage the Lead Agency to evaluate the potential of Transportation Demand Management (TDM) strategies and Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) applications to better manage the transportation network, as well as transit service and bicycle or pedestrian connectivity improvements.
