Project Title: Whispering Oaks Reservoir Sediment Removal

**Project Location – County/Specific:** The project is located three miles north of Catheys Valley in Mariposa County, California at Bear Creek Lake, aka Whispering Oaks Reservoir (Nat. ID: CA01346). Center coordinates of site: Lat.: 37.472677° Long.: -120.110948° Universal Transverse Mercator: 10.

**Description of Nature, Purpose and Beneficiaries of Project:** This project is for maintenance removal of sediment from Whispering Oaks Reservoir for the purposes of preserving capacity, ensuring it can function in its intended purpose of flood control and recreation, protecting the reservoir and its structures, and restoring recreational and aesthetic opportunities.

Two areas totaling 0.8 acres have been identified for sediment removal: the Inlet Area, approximately 0.5 acres in size; and the West Bank area, approximately 0.3 acres in size. The volume of sediment to be removed by scoop is estimated at 25,000 cubic yards. The lake would be slowly drained during the seasonal low to expose project areas. The lake bed would be allowed to dry. At the edge of the lake, the hauling route would utilize existing gravel roads to haul away the sediment (spoils). The spoils would be hauled to the front yard of one of the landowners (5512 Bear Creek Drive, Catheys Valley) and spread out to raise the level of yard by a few feet.

Approximately 25,000 cubic yards of sediment will be removed. The eastern shoreline, the dam, and lacustrine region near the dam are excluded from the project area.

Both the public who use the lake recreationally and the county benefit from the project. The project will restore the water storage capacity of the reservoir and reduce flood risk, restore scenic views, and recreational opportunities. Periodic sediment removal is a critical component of dam and reservoir maintenance.

# Reason Why Project Is Exempt:

Project falls under section §15301(h) for Existing Facilities; maintenance of water supply reservoirs. The reservoir has existed since 1968 and requires periodic removal of sediment to maintain both appearance and storage volume capacity. Sediment buildup has altered the current landscape from the historical norm and reduced reservoir volume below design capacity. Removal of sediment will restore the reservoir supply volume and restore landscape to historical norms.

### NOTICE

Each project applicant shall remit to the county clerk the environmental filing fee before or at the time of filing a Notice of Determination (Pub. Resources Code, § 21152; Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subdivision (d); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5). Without the appropriate fee, statutory or categorical exemption, or a valid No Effect Determination issued by the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), the Notice of Determination is not operative, vested, or final, and shall not be accepted by the county clerk.

# COUNTY DOCUMENTARY HANDLING FEE

The county clerk may charge a documentary handling fee of fifty dollars (\$50) per filing in addition to the environmental filing fee (Fish & G. Code, § 711.4, subd. (e); Cal. Code Regs., tit. 14, § 753.5, subd. (g)(1)). A county board of supervisors shall have the authority to increase or decrease the fee or charge, that is otherwise authorized to be levied by another provision of law, in the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service or the cost of enforcing any regulation for which the fee or charge is levied (Gov. Code, § 54985, subd. (a)).

## DOCUMENT RETENTION

The county shall retain two copies of the cash receipt (for lead agency and county clerk) and a copy of all documents described above for at least 12 months

### RECEIPT NUMBER

- # The first two digits automatically populate by making the appropriate selection in the County/State Agency of Filing drop down menu.
- The next eight digits automatically populate when a date is entered.
- # The last three digits correspond with the sequential order of issuance for each calendar year. For example, the first receipt number issued on January 1 should end in 001.
