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NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF A DRAFT SUBSEQUENT ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORT FOR THE STREAM MAINTENANCE PROGRAM RENEWAL – DATED MAY 2022 (STATE CLEARINGHOUSE NUMBER: 2022050564)

Dear Mr. Williams:

The Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) received a Notice of Preparation of a Draft Subsequent Environmental Impact Report (DSEIR) for the Stream Maintenance Program Renewal (Project). The Lead Agency is receiving this notice from DTSC because the Project includes one or more of the following: presence of site structures that may require demolition or modifications, and/or importation of backfill soil.

DTSC recommends that the following issues be evaluated in the Hazards and Hazardous Materials section of the DSEIR:

1. If buildings or other structures are to be demolished on any project sites included in the proposed project, surveys should be conducted for the presence of lead-based paints or products, mercury, asbestos containing materials, and polychlorinated biphenyl caulk. Removal, demolition and disposal of any of the above-mentioned chemicals should be conducted in compliance with California environmental regulations and policies. In addition, sampling near current and/or former buildings or other structures should be conducted in accordance with DTSC's 2006 <u>Interim Guidance Evaluation of School Sites with Potential</u>
Contamination from Lead Based Paint, Termiticides, and Electrical Transformers.

> If any projects initiated as part of the proposed project require the importation of soil to backfill any excavated areas, proper sampling should be conducted to ensure that the imported soil is free of contamination. DTSC recommends the imported materials be characterized according to <u>DTSC's 2001 Information</u> <u>Advisory Clean Imported Fill Material</u>.
