Thank you for including the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) in the environmental review process for the Oakland Harbor Turning Basins Widening. We are committed to ensuring that impacts to the State's multimodal transportation system and to our natural environment are identified and mitigated to support a safe, sustainable, integrated and efficient transportation system. The following comments are based on our review of the May 2022 NOP.

Project Understanding

The proposed project would increase the width of the Port's two existing turning basins to accommodate a vessel with a capacity of 19,000 Twenty-Foot Equivalent Uni (TEU) and a length of 1,310 feet. This project will also require federal approval under National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

Climate Change

Please keep Caltrans Transportation Planning & Local Assistance's Climate Change Branch informed about the adaptation measures as they are developed and implemented near the Oakland Harbor shoreline. Caltrans D4 is interested in engaging in multi-agency collaboration early and often, to find multi-benefit sea level rise solutions when planning and implementing adaptation measures, including nature-based solutions.
