Description of Project: The project would update an existing storm drain pump station site (known as the D33 El Paraiso Storm Drain Pump Station). Modifications include the following:

- Replace the existing electrical system, including building a new block building;
- Replace the existing trash racks and adding a new conveyor system;
- Replace one existing pump;
- Replace existing fencing; and,
- Other minor site improvements.

CATEGORICAL EXEMPTION - Section 15301, Class 1 and Section 15311, Class 11

Reasons why project is exempt:

The project would update the existing pump station and would not substantially increase capacity of the station. It would not require the removal of structures, vegetation, or trees. While some construction of accessory structures would be required, the project would occur in previously disturbed areas and would not impact known or unknown historical resources or biological resources. The project site is not on a list complied pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code nor is it within the viewshed of a scenic highway. It can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant impact on the environment and is therefore exempt from the provisions of CEQA
