PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Kaweah Oaks Preserve (KOP) Ecological Restoration and Training project is located approximately 4 mi east of the City of Visalia. KOP is an intact valley oak woodland. It is an important habitat for many plant and animal species. In 2016 a wildland fire killed many large valley oaks on the northern portion of the preserve. The goal of this project is to provide a training location for the engines and firefighter hand crews in the Unit. This training will include the limbing of ladder fuels and decreasing the horizontal continuity of fuels, and handline construction, followed by a prescribed fire to increase the resiliency of the valley oak woodland habitat to wildfire.
