

## NOTICE OF INTENT TO ADOPT A MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND NOTICE OF AVAILABILITY OF AN INITIAL STUDY WITH PROPOSED MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION (IS/MND) FOR THE STATE ROUTE **121 TULUCAY CREEK BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT**



### WHAT'S BEING PLANNED?

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) has prepared an Initial Study with Proposed Mitigated Negatived Declaration (IS/MND) for the SR 121 Tulucay Creek Bridge Replacement Project in Napa, California. Caltrans proposes to replace the existing Tulucay Creek Bridge with a new, wider bridge that would conform to the creek channel alignment and restore the structural integrity of the bridge for continued use by the traveling public.

### WHY THIS AD?

Caltrans, as the lead agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) has prepared an IS/MND to analyze the potential environmental effects of the proposed project. This notice is to inform you of the public comment period.
