Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

A Site Approval application to establish the use of a mechanic-training facility. The proposed business will provide training for truck mechanics and truck collision body repair technicians to be certified repair technicians. The training facility will operate Monday through Friday during regular business hours (8am-5pm) and will include 40 employees. The project will be completed in one phase and will include the construction of a 12,362 square foot single-story, metal frame building. The proposed building will consist of four shops (including two roll-up doors), four training facility areas, three offices, one storage area, one meeting room, one breakroom, and restroom facilities. The project site contains an existing truck sales facility, which is not a part of this application. The applicant proposes to utilize existing public water service from the City of Stockton, proposes a new septic system for sewer service, and will use an existing on-site retention pond for storm drainage. This parcel is not under a Williamson Act contract.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

The Natural Diversity Database identifies the Suisun Marsh aster (Aster lentus), burrowing owl (Athene Cunicularia), Tricolored blackbird (Agelaius Tricolor), and the Swainson's Hawk (Buteo Swainsoni) as rare, endangered, or threatened species located on or near the project area. Referrals have been sent to the San Joaquin Council of Governments (SJCOG) for review. SJCOG has determined that the applicant may participate in the San Joaquin Multi-Species Habitat Conservation and Open Space Plan (SJMSCP), and the applicant has confirmed participation. As a result, the proposed project is consistent with the SJMSCP, as amended, as reflected in the conditions of project approval for this proposal. Pursuant to the Final EIR/EIS for San Joaquin County Multi-Species Habitat Conservation and Open Space Plan (SJMSCP), dated November 15, 2000, and certified by SJCOG on December 7, 2000, implementation of the SJMSCP is expected to reduce impacts to biological resources resulting from the proposed project to a level of less-than-significant..
