Potentially significant impacts to biological resources were identified in the Initial Study, including impacts to native trees, jurisdictional areas, and coastal Environmentally Sensitive Habitat Areas (ESHAs). Mitigation measures for the following resources include:

- Jurisdictional areas and coastal ESHAs: compensatory mitigation for permanent impacts at a 3:1 ratio, restoration of temporary impacts at a 1:1 ratio, obtain permits from resource agencies, use of Environmentally Sensitive Fencing, work windows, erosion control.
- **Native Trees:** replanted at a 10:1 replacement ratio within or adjacent to existing woodlands or riparian areas within Caltrans right-of-way.
