Work includes laying an asphalt rubber chip seal and Hot Mix Asphalt (HMA). Removal of thermoplastic pavement markings will be required. All work will be contained within the existing edge of pavement. No vegetation removal is anticipated. No work will be done on bridge decks. Guardrail may be upgraded as necessary.

**Purpose:** The purpose of the project is to bring the pavement to a condition that requires minimal maintenance and improve rideability.

**Need:** The existing roadway is in a poor condition with localized areas of severe distress. Routine maintenance has not been sufficient to maintain an adequate road surface.

### Right-of-Way

Acquisitions or TCEs will not be needed for this project due to work being confined to ROW.

### Staging/Stockpiling

Multiple locations are available for staging/stockpiling use. No grading and/or site preparation will occur. Approved staging locations include: PM 10.55 NB, PM 11.20 NB, PM 12.95 NB, PM 15.16 NB, PM 16.16 NB, PM 17.30 NB, PM 19.51 NB, PM 20.69 NB, PM 21.43 NB, PM 23.18 NB, PM 23.99 NB, PM 24.50 NB, PM 25.26 SB, PM 26.44-26.55 NB/SB, PM 39.96 NB, PM 40.5 SB, PM 42.0 NB.

#### **Disposal/Borrow Sites**

The project would not utilize borrowed material. If any excess material is generated, it will be a small enough quantity to become property of the contractor.

#### **Utilities**

All utilities in proximity to the locations of work would be protected in place; no utility conflicts are anticipated.

#### Coordination/Consultation

Caltrans has performed an environmental evaluation consisting of a review of resource records and databases, consultation, and coordination with applicable agencies and individuals.

#### **Permits**

No permits are necessary with current scope of work.

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
