- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County Coroner should be contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98, if the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) which will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At that time, the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.
- A Caltrans Principal Architectural Historian will photo document the turnbuckle and the two wedge shoes before and after the installation of the of the wedge shoes and turnbuckle, as well as review the construction plans as developed and monitor construction activities on the Old River Bridge. The new equipment will be painted in similar color schemes for the bridge, if applicable. Should any significant changes be made to the construction plans or during construction activities that have the potential to impact the historic property in an adverse manner, the District 10 Environmental Office will notify the State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) immediately and additional documentation, as appropriate, will be completed to assess the impacts to Old River Bridge.
