Subject: Cultural Resources Assessment for the Veterans Affairs Bakersfield Community Based

Outpatient Clinic Project, City of Bakersfield, County of Kern, California (Project Number C-

Dear Mr. Doctor:

At the request of SASD Development Group, LLC. (CLIENT), Duke Cultural Resources Management, LLC (DUKE CRM) has prepared a cultural resources assessment for the Veterans Affairs Bakersfield Community Based Outpatient Clinic (Project), located in the City of Bakersfield, Kern County, California (see Attachment 1, Map 1. Project Aerial Map). The Project is approximately 7-acres located on APNs 365-020-28 and -30. The City of Bakersfield (City) is the lead agency for the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). Veterans Affairs has already conducted compliance with the National Historic Preservation (NHPA or Section 106). There is no federal involvement in our work.

The Project is located in Section 15, Township 29 South, Range 27 East as shown on the 1954 United States Geological Survey *Oildale, Calif* 7.5' quadrangle map (photo revised 1968; see Attachment 1, Map 2. Project Location Map). It is located approximately 275 feet (ft.) southeast of the intersection of Knudsen Street and Olive Drive and includes the construction of a 30,000 square foot medical outpatient clinic (see Attachment 1, Map 3. Project Aerial Map). Maximum depth of excavation will be 7 ft., with the majority of excavation being 2 ft.

Cultural Resources Research

On March 22, 2022, DUKE CRM conducted a record search at the Southern San Joaquin Valley Information Center (SSJVIC). The SSJVIC is part of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) and is located at California State University, Bakersfield. The records search included a review of all recorded cultural resources and reports within a ½ -mile radius of the Project (see Attachment 2).

The records search identified 13 cultural resources within ½-mile of the Project, with no cultural resources recorded within the Project boundaries. Table 1 below lists the cultural resources in the record search area and their proximity to the Project boundary.

The SSJVIC identified a total of 22 cultural resource reports within ½ -mile of the Project. None of the reports are located within the Project boundary.

Additionally, an inquiry to the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) was submitted to ascertain the presence of known sacred sites, Native American cultural resources, and/or human remains within the boundaries of the proposed Project. On May 25, 2022, the NAHC indicated that there have been no Native American cultural resources identified within the Sacred Lands File for the Project location (see Attachment 2).

Field Survey

DUKE CRM Archaeologist Morgan Bender, M.A., RPA, conducted an intensive pedestrian survey of the Project on March 22, 2022. The survey included the 7-acres of the proposed Project. There was approximately 20 to 40 percent ground visibility of the Project. The survey was conducted using parallel transects no greater than 15 meters apart. The area had tall grasses that led to low to moderate visibility with modern debris scattered throughout the Project. The site has a mean elevation of approximately 430 feet above sea level. No cultural resources (prehistoric or historic greater than 45 years old) were observed as a result of the field survey. Visible sediment is medium brown silt with a moderate degree of surface disturbance due to pedestrian and vehicle traffic. See photographs in Attachment 5.

Conclusions

DUKE CRM assessed the proposed Project for the presence of cultural resources according to CEQA. Our research and pedestrian survey did not identify cultural resources within the Project boundaries. The Project is considered to have a low potential for the presence of prehistoric and historic era archaeological resources given the lack of previously or newly identified cultural resources within or near the Project area. The nearest recorded prehistoric resource is a quartzite cobble isolate located approximately 575 feet to the south of the Project. Additionally, the nearest historic resource is the Beardsley One Ditch, an abandoned portion of the Beardsley Irrigation Canal, located approximately 560 feet to east of the Project. The remainder of the historic resources in proximity to the Project area are structures that will not be impacted by the Project. Therefore, it is not likely that cultural resources will be impacted by the Project. DUKE CRM does not recommend any additional work for cultural resources. However, if ground disturbing activities associated with this Project change, these changes may have the potential to disturb sediments that are previously undisturbed and may contain previously unidentified cultural resources.

If previously unidentified archaeological materials are unearthed during construction, work shall be halted in that area until a qualified archaeologist can assess the significance of the find. If human remains are encountered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that no further disturbance shall occur until the County Coroner has determined the origin and disposition pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98. The County Coroner must be notified of the find immediately. If the remains are determined to be prehistoric, the Coroner will notify the NAHC, which will determine and notify a Most Likely Descendant (MLD). With the permission of the landowner or their authorized representative, the MLD may inspect the site of the discovery. The MLD shall conduct the inspection within 48 hours of notification by the NAHC. The MLD may

recommend scientific removal and nondestructive analysis of human remains and items associated with Native American burials.








Map 3 - Project Aerial Photo







Project Area





SSJVIC RECORD SEARCH MAPS



A record search of the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) Sacred Lands File (SLF) was completed for the information you have submitted for the above referenced project. The results were negative. However, the absence of specific site information in the SLF does not indicate the absence of cultural resources in any project area. Other sources of cultural resources should also be contacted for information regarding known and recorded sites.

Attached is a list of Native American tribes who may also have knowledge of cultural resources in the project area. This list should provide a starting place in locating areas of potential adverse impact within the proposed project area. I suggest you contact all of those indicated; if they cannot supply information, they might recommend others with specific knowledge. By contacting all those listed, your organization will be better able to respond to claims of failure to consult with the appropriate tribe. If a response has not been received within two weeks of notification, the Commission requests that you follow-up with a telephone call or email to ensure that the project information has been received.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify me. With your assistance, we can assure that our lists contain current information.


