Project Location (include county): The project to be completed is located within the Eel River watershed, approximately 7 miles northeast of the town of Laytonville, County of Mendocino, State of California. The project is located in Section 13, T22 N, R14 W, Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian; in the Iron Peak U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 033-113-05.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number EPIMS-MEN-18634-R1C, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Daniel Coleman.

The project is limited to four (4) encroachments. The four proposed encroachments are to upgrade existing stream crossings, identified as Sites 1, 2, 6 and 7. Work for these encroachments will include excavation, removal of the existing culverts, replacement with new properly sized culvert where indicated (Site 1), backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion. Vehicles shall not be operated on rocked fords when water is present.
