Project Location: The project is located at Donner Lake, in the County of Nevada, State of California; Latitude 39.326741, Longitude -120.240918; 13099 Donner Pass Road Truckee, CA 96161; Assessor's Parcel Number 018-400-003-000.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification Number NEV-30778-R2, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, Ronald Keimach.

The project is limited to the demolition of accessory structures located partially within the 100-year floodplain of Donner Lake. The accessory structures include the removal of an existing rear deck, wood stairs along with a concrete stair landing, and a wooden fence. The rear deck contains 6 concrete supports for wood piers, each measuring 1.5 feet by 1.5 feet in area with an estimated depth of 18 feet. The concrete stair landing that will be removed measures 2 feet by 4.67 feet in area with an estimated depth of 4 feet. The wooden fence being removed is 13 feet long and 6 feet tall anchored with 5, 1.5-foot concrete footings. Once the accessory structures are removed the footprint will be recontoured, reseeded, and landscaped with multiple boulders.
