Cultural

- If cultural resources are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 - 1. Stop all work within a 60-foot radius of the discovery
 - 2. Protect the discovery area
 - 3. Notify the Engineer
 - 4. The Department investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County Coroner should be contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98, if the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) which will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At that time, the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Hazardous Waste

- A lead compliance plan prepared by a Certified Industrial Hygienist is required and grinding must be sampled and disposed of in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. The Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) shall be included in the construction contract.
- The project requires removal of yellow paint/thermoplastic traffic striping and/or pavement markings, which has been determined to be nonhazardous. Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 36-4 shall be added to the contract.

Biology

Marked stakes are required to be installed near the outlet of the culvert. The stakes
will delineate the limits of the East Fork Carson River, where no construction
activities are permitted. The marked stakes will be installed by a Caltrans Biologist
within fourteen (14) days prior to the start of any construction related activities.
Contact the Caltrans D10 Environmental Office 30 days prior to the start of

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construction to schedule the demarcation. Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A shall be included in the construction contract.

• If work occurs during the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), preconstruction surveys must be conducted by a qualified Caltrans biologist within 14 days prior to the start of any construction activities. If active nests are observed, buffers will need to be established around each nest until the young have fledged, per California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) guidelines. A 100-foot buffer shall be established around active nests. For hawks, a 300-foot buffer would need to be established. If construction activities do not commence within 14 days of the cleared survey, or if construction activities stop for more than 14 days, a subsequent bird survey may be required before construction commences or recommences. No construction activities shall commence without clearance from the Caltrans Environmental Office. Include Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A in the construction contract.
