Project Title: Exchange of up to 1,500 acre-feet (af) of Kern-Tulare Water District's (Kern-Tulare) acquired Kings River water with the Kern County Water Agency (Agency) for a like amount of the Agency's State Water Project (SWP) water.

Location -- Specific: The Agency is a SWP contractor located in Kern County in the southern San Joaquin Valley. The Agency's Improvement District No. 4 (ID4) contracts for SWP water through the Agency and is in Kern County in the southern San Joaquin Valley. The SWP includes facilities located throughout the State of California. Kern-Tulare is a Central Valley Project (CVP) contractor located in Kern County. Westlands Water District (Westlands) is a CVP contractor located in Fresno County.

Location -- County: Kern and Fresno Counties.

Description of Activity: In 2022, Kern-Tulare will exchange up to 1,500 af of its previously banked CVP water with the Agency for a like amount of the ID4's SWP water for delivery to Westlands from California Aqueduct turnouts located in the Agency's service area. In exchange, Kern-Tulare will receive up to 1,500 af of Fresno Irrigation District's Kings River water.

Additionally, CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) provides that a Lead Agency may determine an activity to be exempt based on a general rule that CEQA applies only to projects that have a potential for causing a significant effect on the environment. Where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA. The Agency finds that approval of the proposed water transfer has no possibility of significant effect on the environment for the following reasons:
