**Project Title:** Ivanov Water Diversion and Stream Crossings Project (Lake or Streambed Alteration Agreement No. EPIMS-HUM-20982-R1)

**Project Location (include county):** The project to be completed is located within the Little Larabee Creek and the Van Duzen River watersheds, approximately 3.8 miles east of the town of Blocksburg, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Section 9, T1N, R4E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Larabee Valley U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Number 212-022-026; latitude 40.4771 N and longitude 123.7275 W at the point of diversion (POD).

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement number EPIMS-HUM-20982-R1, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Denislav Ivanov.

The project is limited to two encroachments. One encroachment is for water diversion from unnamed tributaries to Little Larabee Creek. Water is diverted for domestic use. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. The other proposed encroachment will realign a stream from an inside ditch to the natural stream alignment. Work for this encroachment will include excavation, installation of a new culvert, backfilling and compaction of fill, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
