Project is in an area of known sensitivity tribal cultural resources. In tribal consultations conducted with the Oholne/Costanoan Esselen Nation (OCEN) and Esselen Tribe of Monterey County, training for construction crews to identify possible tribal resources and tribal monitoring during earthwork and excavation were recommended due to the general sensitivity of the Carmel point for tribal cultural resources. In addition, compliance with the County's standard conditions of approval would ensure that the discovery of unanticipated tribal cultural resources are handled and treated in accordance with State regulations. Implementation of Mitigation Measures CR-1 and the following standard condition of approval would reduce potential impacts to previously unidentified tribal resources. The project would also be required to mitigate impacts related to lead-based paint and comply with MBARD District Rule 424 since the house was constructed in 1973. Therefore, to reduce potential impacts related to the discovery of lead-based paint and asbestos, Mitigation Measures HAZ-1 and HAZ-2 are required.
