Re: Native American Consultation, Pursuant to Senate Bill 18 (SB18), Government Codes §65352.3 and §65352.4, as well as Assembly Bill 52 (AB52), Public Resources Codes §21080.1, §21080.3.1 and §21080.3.2, General Plan Amendment 21-004, Conditional Use Permit 21-024, Zoning Text Amendment 22-005, Environmental Impact Report 21-004 (Bolsa Chica Senior Living Community) Project, Orange County

Dear Mr. Beckman:

Attached is a consultation list of tribes with traditional lands or cultural places located within the boundaries of the above referenced counties or projects.

Government Codes §65352.3 and §65352.4 require local governments to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to cultural places when creating or amending General Plans, Specific Plans and Community Plans.

Public Resources Codes §21080.3.1 and §21080.3.2 requires public agencies to consult with California Native American tribes identified by the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) for the purpose of avoiding, protecting, and/or mitigating impacts to tribal cultural resources as defined, for California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) projects.

The law does not preclude local governments and agencies from initiating consultation with the tribes that are culturally and traditionally affiliated within your jurisdiction. The NAHC believes that this is the best practice to ensure that tribes are consulted commensurate with the intent of the law.

Best practice for the AB52 process and in accordance with Public Resources Code §21080.3.1(d), is to do the following:

Within 14 days of determining that an application for a project is complete or a decision by a public agency to undertake a project, the lead agency shall provide formal notification to the designated contact of, or a tribal representative of, traditionally and culturally affiliated California Native American tribes that have requested notice, which shall be accomplished by means of at least one written notification that includes a brief description of the proposed project and its location, the lead agency contact information, and a notification that the California Native American tribe has 30 days to request consultation pursuant to this section.

The NAHC also recommends, but does not require that lead agencies include in their notification letters, information regarding any cultural resources assessment that has been completed on the area of potential affect (APE), such as:

- 1. The results of any record search that may have been conducted at an Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS), including, but not limited to:
 - A listing of any and all known cultural resources have already been recorded on or adjacent to the APE, such as known archaeological sites;
 - Copies of any and all cultural resource records and study reports that may have been provided by the Information Center as part of the records search response;
 - Whether the records search indicates a low, moderate or high probability that unrecorded cultural resources are located in the APE; and
 - If a survey is recommended by the Information Center to determine whether previously unrecorded cultural resources are present.
- 2. The results of any archaeological inventory survey that was conducted, including:
 - Any report that may contain site forms, site significance, and suggested mitigation measures.

All information regarding site locations, Native American human remains, and associated funerary objects should be in a separate confidential addendum, and not be made available for public disclosure in accordance with Government Code Section 6254.10.

- 3. The result of the Sacred Lands File (SLF) check conducted through the Native American Heritage Commission was <u>negative</u>.
- 4. Any ethnographic studies conducted for any area including all or part of the potential APE; and
- 5. Any geotechnical reports regarding all or part of the potential APE.

Lead agencies should be aware that records maintained by the NAHC and CHRIS is not exhaustive, and a negative response to these searches does not preclude the existence of a tribal cultural resource. A tribe may be the only source of information regarding the existence of a tribal cultural resource.

This information will aid tribes in determining whether to request formal consultation. In the event, that they do, having the information beforehand well help to facilitate the consultation process.

If you receive notification of change of addresses and phone numbers from tribes, please notify the NAHC. With your assistance we can assure that our consultation list remains current.

Dear Native American Tribal Leaders:

The City of Huntington Beach has initiated environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) for the Bolsa Chica Senior Living Community project, located the southwest corner of Bolsa Chica Street at Warner Avenue, at 4952 and 4972 Warner Avenue, 92649. The project site is comprised of two parcels totaling 3.1 acres, currently developed with existing commercial retail and office space totaling approximately 55,000 square feet within a two story commercial building fronting Warner Avenue and a three story office building fronting Bolsa Chica Street. The proposed project includes a request to demolish the existing commercial buildings to construct a five-story approximately 285,150 square foot senior living facility consisting of 202 total living units, 207 on-site parking spaces within a subterranean parking garage, and associated hardscape and landscape improvements. The project location map is enclosed for your information.

The project site contains two separate adjacent parcels, which upon project implementation, the existing lot lines would be adjusted. The components of the request are as follows:

<u>General Plan Amendment No. 21-004</u> – To amend the General Plan Land Use Map by changing the General Plan Land Use designation of the subject parcels from CG (Commercial General) to Mixed Use (MU);

Zoning Map Amendment No. 21-003 – To amend the Zoning Map by changing the zoning land use designation of the subject parcels from CG (Commercial General) to SP (Specific Plan);

<u>Conditional Use Permit No. 21-024</u> – To permit the establishment and operation of a convalescent facility use, permit the on-site sale, service, and consumption of alcoholic beverages to residents and their guests, and permit the construction of the proposed facility on a property with an existing grade differential in excess of 3 ft. that includes the

excavation of approximately 55,000 cubic yards of soils. The new facility would be fully licensed by the California Department of Social Services, Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) per California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 22, Division 6, Chapter 8 as a Residential Care Facility for the Elderly (RCFE); and

<u>Environmental Impact Report No. 2021-004</u> – To analyze the potential environmental impacts associated with the project.

We are hereby notifying you of an opportunity to consult with us regarding the potential for this project to impact Tribal Cultural Resources, as defined in Section 21074 of the PRC. As part of the CEQA process, the purpose of tribal consultation under AB 52 is to determine whether or not Tribal Cultural Resources are present within the project area, and if so, whether or not those resources will be significantly impacted by the project. If Tribal Cultural Resources may be significantly impacted, then consultation would help to determine the most appropriate way to avoid or mitigate those impacts.

In accordance with Section 21080.3.1(d) of the PRC, you have 30 days from the receipt of this letter to request AB 52 consultation in writing for this project.
