... Temporary Construction Easements (TCE) may be required. The purpose of this project is to improve culvert function and flow capacities. The project is needed to extend the service life of SR-88 and ensure motorist safety over these drainages.

General

 Environmental reevaluation will be required if the scope of the project changes to include additional areas or activities, or if previously unknown cultural or other sensitive resources are discovered. Contact Environmental Office if project changes occur or sensitive resources discovered.

Cultural

- If cultural resources are discovered at the job site, do not disturb the resources and immediately:
 - 1. Stop all work within a 60-foot radius of the discovery
 - 2. Protect the discovery area
 - 3. Notify the Engineer
 - 4. The Department investigates. Do not move cultural materials or take them from the job site. Retain a qualified archeologist to assess the significance of the find. Do not resume work within the discovery area until authorized.
- If human remains are discovered, State Health and Safety Code Section 7050.5 states that further disturbances and activities shall cease in any area or nearby area suspected to overlie remains, and the County Coroner should be contacted. Pursuant to Public Resources Code Section 5097.98, if the remains are thought to be Native American, the coroner will notify the Native American Heritage Commission (NAHC) which will then notify the Most Likely Descendent (MLD). At that time, the landowner will work with the MLD on the respectful treatment and disposition of the remains. Further provisions of PRC 5097.98 are to be followed as applicable.

Hazardous Waste

 A lead compliance plan prepared by a Certified Industrial Hygienist is required and grinding must be sampled and disposed of in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations. The Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 7-1.02K(6)(j)(iii) shall be included in the construction contract.

Biology

• If work occurs during the migratory bird nesting season (February 1 – September 30), preconstruction surveys must be conducted by a qualified Caltrans District 10 biologist within 14 days prior to the start of any construction activities. If active nests are observed, buffers will need to be established around each nest until the young have fledged, per California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) guidelines. A 100-foot buffer shall be established around active nests. For hawks, a 300-foot buffer would need to be established. If construction activities do not

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commence within 14 days of the cleared survey, or if construction activities stop for more than 14 days, a subsequent bird survey may be required before construction commences or recommences. No construction activities shall commence without clearance from the Caltrans Environmental Office. Include Caltrans Standard Special Provision (SSP) 14-6.03A in the construction contract.

 At Location 4 (PM R65.74) work may only occur when the culvert outlet is dry. Include SSP 10-1.03A in the construction contract to restrict all construction related activities at this location to September 1 – October 30 of any given year. No work is allowed between November 1 – August 31 of any given year.

No permits required.

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
