Project Location: The project is located at Lake Tahoe, in the County of Placer, State of California; Latitude 39.08477° North, Longitude 120.15880° West; 5190 West Lake Blvd. Homewood, CA, 96141.

Project Description: The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification Number PLA-28021-R2, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to the project Applicant, WS Marina LLC DBA Homewood High & Dry Marina (Permittee) as represented by David Topol.

The project is limited to excavation of approximately 241 cubic yards of accumulated lake sediments from the boat launch area of the Homewood High and Dry Marina by means of a barge mounted long reach excavator. The marina area will be surrounded by a turbidity curtain to minimize any turbidity in surrounding lake waters during dredging operations. All excavated sediments will be placed into lined dump trucks or roll-off containers then transported and disposed of outside of the lake basin. The marina boat launch area will be excavated to a mean elevation of 6,217.0 ft.
