Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The applicant seeks approval of a tentative map that would subdivide the subject 1.5-acre parcel into two parcels. 0.09 acres of right-of-way would be dedicated for future road widening of N. Jackson Way, resulting in approximate gross lot areas of 0.46-acres (Parcel A) & 0.95 acres (Parcel B). Approximately 25% of Parcel B is restricted from development (grant deed of development rights over the San Ramon Creek area). Site improvements include a 16-foot paved road within a 35- to 39.6-foot-wide access easement for access to Parcel B from N. Jackson Way and one bio-retention area on Parcel B. No changes are proposed for the existing residence/driveway on Parcel A, however, the applicant requests variances from the R-20 zoning district standards for a substandard secondary front setback and a substandard side yard to the existing residence. The applicant also requests exceptions from Title 9 requirements of the County Ordinance Code related to the undergrounding of overhead utility services and to sidewalk/curb improvements along N. Jackson Way. Approval of a tree permit is also requested to allow work within the driplines or removal of 15 code-protected trees. ±155 cubic yards (CYS) of net fill (±320 CYS of cut & ±475 CYS of fill) is anticipated for future roadway/foundation pad.

Identify the project's significant or potentially significant effects and briefly describe any proposed mitigation measures that would reduce or avoid that effect.

- Air Quality: Bay Area Air Quality Management District Basic Construction mitigation measures during construction would reduce temporary impacts from, e.g., dust, loose materials, and idling trucks/equipment.
- Biological Resources: mitigations include requiring pre-construction avian, basking hepetofauna, and bat surveys by a
 qualified biologist and providing buffers around nesting/roosting sites, delaying tree removal or construction until the end
 of nesting or roosting periods, and consulting with the CDFW if any special-status basking herpetofauna (e.g., Alameda
 whipsnakes) or occupied bat roosts/maternity colonies are identified in the project site.
- Cultural Resources/Tribal Cultural Resources: mitigations include stopping work and requiring a qualified archaeologist
 or the County Coroner to examine the site/materials if any prehistoric/historical materials or human remains are
 encountered during ground disturbance activities.
- Geology/Soils: mitigations include submittal of an updated, design-level geotechnical report for review by County Geologist, observation/testing/report by project geotechnical engineer during construction activities.
- Noise: mitigations include submittal of a noise assessment by a qualified acoustician for review by the County Community Development Division with recommendations, if warranted, for special design/construction materials to reduce residential interior and/or exterior noise levels to those acceptable as established in the Noise and Land Use Compatibility Guidelines contained in the Noise Element of the County General Plan.
