We understand that the Buttonwillow County Water District (District) is pursuing Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) financing for this Project (CWSRF No. C-06-8515-110). As a funding agency and a state agency with jurisdiction by law to preserve, enhance, and restore the quality of California's water resources, the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) is providing the following water quality comments on the IS/MND circulating for the Project.

The State Water Board, Division of Financial Assistance, is responsible for administering the CWSRF Program (Program). The primary purpose for the Program is to implement the Clean Water Act and various state laws by providing financial assistance for wastewater treatment facilities necessary to prevent water pollution, recycle water, correct nonpoint source and storm drainage pollution problems, provide for estuary enhancement, and thereby protect and promote health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the state.

All applicants seeking funding must comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and provide appropriate documents to the State Water Board so that it can fulfill its CEQA responsibilities, see <u>CEQA Requirements</u>. In addition, because the Program is partially funded by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) additional federal environmental documentation (cross-cutters) may be required. Following are specific comments on the District's draft IS/MND:

1. Section IIa and IIe have conflicting acreage of important farmland that will be used. IIa page 13 states that an approximate 2 acres for the solar farm will remove important farmland from farming activity, while IIe page 14 states that an

approximate on-acre site designated as Farmland of Statewide Importance will be converted to water supply production. Can you please clarify if these are two separate sites or if Ile should state two-acres?

2. The attached 2022 BRA mentions a sewer pipeline that would follow approximately the same path as the proposed water pipeline in the IS/MND. Can you please confirm that the sewer pipeline is no longer a part of this project?
