Project Description (Proposed actions, location, and/or consequences).

The applicant seeks approval of a tentative map that would subdivide the subject 1.1-acre parcel into two parcels. , resulting in approximate gross lot areas of 0.44-acres (Parcel A) & 0.66 acres (Parcel B). Site preparation associated with the subdivision includes the demolition of an existing tennis court located in the area of Parcel B, the construction of private access roadway within a 25-foot wide private easement, and emergency vehicle turnaround, for access to Parcel B from Cherry Lane. The project also includes storm drain improvements and connection to existing sanitary sewer and water mains existing on or adjacent to the project site. No changes are proposed for the existing residence/driveway on Parcel A. Approval of a tree permit is also requested to allow the removal of five (5) code protected trees and work within the driplines of an additional three code-protected trees.
