**Project Title:** Santa Cruz County, CSA 51 900 Hopkins Gulch Road Storm Damage Repair Project (Notification of Lake or Streambed Alteration, No. EPIMS-SCR-22293-R3).

**Project Location (Santa Cruz County):** The Project is located at Hopkins Gulch, a tributary to Bear Creek, at 900 Hopkins Gulch Road, Boulder Creek, CA, 95006, in the County of Santa Cruz, State of California; Latitude 37.14658, Longitude -122.10360; APN 089-081-21.

**Project Description:** The California Department of Fish and Wildlife has executed Lake and Streambed Alteration Agreement EPIMS Notification No. EPIMS-SCR-22293-R3, pursuant to Section 1602 of the Fish and Game Code to Santa Cruz County Department of Public Works.

The Project is limited to the repair of a 40 linear foot slip out approximately 0.7 miles up Hopkins Gulch Road. The Project will remove debris as a result of the slip out including man-made debris such as pavement, rock slope protection (RSP), and trash, and vegetation that interferes with construction access. A new 96-foot-long soldier pile wall will be installed east (downslope) of the roadway. A down drain extension will be added to the end of the existing culvert and six cubic yards of RSP covering 46 square feet will be installed at the culvert outlet for energy dissipation. Additionally, two cubic yards of RSP will be placed below the wall in two low points.

This project will repair failures along Hopkins Gulch Road that occurred during and as a result of the declared emergency.
