



#### **LONG BEACH EARTHQUAKE OF 1933**


- Prior to earthquake most schools were of masonry construction
- Heavily damaged after earthquake
- Temporary tent schools
- California passed the Field Act



#### WPA DEVELOPMENT - PARKINSON & PARKINSON

Federal program to alleviate unemployment during the Great Depression:

- SMMUSD received 1.5\$ Million in Federal Funds
- Included stabilization of McKinley by Parkinson & Parkinson in 1937

A/1/1: 1923-1937

- 1920s Development of School (Institutional History)
- Post-earthquake rehabilitation
- WPA involvement- Federal program to alleviate mass unemployment during the Great Depression

- Rehabilitation by Parkinson & Parkinson for modern seismic retrofitting but also retained appearance
