Potential impacts to biological resources would be reduced to a less than significant level with implementation of Mitigation Measures BIO-1 through BIO-4. The Proposed Project is not anticipated to have the potential to significantly degrade the overall quality of the region's environment, or substantially reduce the habitat of a fish or wildlife species, cause a fish or wildlife population or drop below self-sustaining levels, threaten to eliminate a plant or animal community, reduce the number or restrict the range of a rare or endangered plant or animal. No significant impacts to cultural resources were identified in the Phase I Cultural Resources Investigation prepared for the Proposed Project. Julie Gilbert from ELMT Consulting did not find any evidence of historical or prehistorical resources on the Project Site. However, implementation of Mitigation Measures CR-1, CR-2, CR-3, TCR-1 and TCR-2 would ensure that the Proposed Project does not eliminate important examples of the major periods of California history or prehistory including tribal ancestral lands as identified during the tribal consultation process. Therefore, impacts are not cumulatively considerable. Development of the Proposed Project will be conditioned to comply with current MDAQMD rules and regulations to minimize impacts to air quality.
