Records at this office were reviewed to determine if this project could adversely affect cultural resources. <u>Please note that use of the term cultural resources includes both archaeological sites and historical buildings</u> <u>and/or structures.</u> <u>The review for possible historic-era building/structures, however, was limited to</u> <u>references currently in our office and should not be considered comprehensive.</u>

Project Description:

Resource Management Permit, Grading Permit for a 790-cu. yd. of cut and fill, Architectural Review Exemption for new 3,996 sq. ft. two-story single-family residence. Grading work includes grading for proposed new house, driveway, site work and landscaping. The existing garage (824 sq. ft.) will be retained, and the existing cottage (1,099 sq. ft.) will be converted into an ADU. The project also involves constructing new driveway approaches from Misty Lane.

Previous Studies:

<u>XX</u> This office has no record of any previous <u>cultural resource</u> field survey for the proposed project area conducted by a professional archaeologist or architectural historian (*see recommendation below*).

Archaeological and Native American Resources Recommendations:

- <u>XX</u> The proposed project area has the possibility of containing unrecorded <u>archaeological site(s)</u>. A study by a qualified professional archaeologist is recommended prior to commencement of project activities.

Built Environment Recommendations:

XX Since the Office of Historic Preservation has determined that any building or structure 45 years or older may be of historical value, if the project area contains such properties, it is recommended that prior to commencement of project activities, a qualified professional familiar with the architecture and history of San Mateo County conduct a formal CEQA evaluation.

Due to processing delays and other factors, not all of the historical resource reports and resource records that have been submitted to the Office of Historic Preservation are available via this records search. Additional information may be available through the federal, state, and local agencies that produced or paid for historical resource management work in the search area. Additionally, Native American tribes have historical resource information not in the California Historical Resources Information System (CHRIS) Inventory, and you should contact the California Native American Heritage Commission for information on local/regional tribal contacts.
