LRCCD is proposing to construct Beach Volleyball Facilities located in the recreational part of the CRC campus. The proposedBeach Volleyball Facilities Project consists of the construction of six (6) beach volleyball courts. Each court would be constructed with sand up to 18 inches in depth with individual drainage systems consisting of 6-inch diameter perforated drainpipe, angular drain rock, and geotextile non-woven fabric. Other proposed plans include installation of chain link fencingaround the perimeter of the beach volleyball court facilities, the removal of 12 trees, sport lighting, concrete hard scape,additional landscaping, an official's tent, referee stands, and a lockable electrical pedestal for a PA system.
