Description of Nature, Purpose, and Beneficiaries of Project:

The Sierra Nevada Conservancy would provide funding for Tulare County to partner with Sequoia National Forest (SQF) to address hazard tree mitigation needs from the Pier, Windy, and Castle fires. SNC funding will be used for approximately 9 miles of treatments along Forest Service Roads in and around the communities of Sierra Crest, Alpine Village, Camp Nelson, Cedar Slope, Ponderosa, and Johnsondale. SQF will treat additional areas for a total of approximately 25 miles of roadside treatments. Hazard tree removal will consist of hand and mechanical felling, and will require skidding of logs, managing areas for processing, and loading and hauling material. Biomass disposal options will depend on the proportion of market to non-market material and capacity of facilities. The Sierra Nevada Conservancy previously filed an NOE for this project on March 6, 2023; this additional NOE identifies all NEPA analyses under which work may occur.

CEQA does not apply to prescribed fire, reforestation, habitat restoration, thinning, or fuel reduction projects, or to related activities included in the project description, undertaken, in whole or in part, on federal lands to reduce the risk of high-severity wildfire that have been reviewed under the federal National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 if the primary role of a state or local agency is providing funding or staffing for those projects. The Sierra Nevada Conservancy would provide funding to conduct fire recovery and restoration activities through fuel reduction on federal lands in Sequoia National Forest. The proposed activities were reviewed in their entirety under NEPA by the Sequoia National Forest in the Pier Fire Roadside Hazard Tree Mitigation Project, with a Categorical Exclusion Decision Memo signed on October 3, 2018. SNC has determined that the proposed activities were also reviewed in their entirety under NEPA by the Sequoia National Forest as follows: The Castle Fire North Road Hazard Tree *Mitigation Project* with a Categorical Exclusion Decision Memo signed on August 25, 2021, and by U.S. Forest Service Region 5 in the Region 5 Post-disturbance Hazardous Tree Management Project - Southern Sierra Zone Hazard Tree Mitigation Environmental Assessment with Decision Memo signed on January 24, 2023.
