Project Location: The project to be completed is located in the Eel River watershed, approximately 1.25 miles north of the community of Briceland, County of Humboldt, State of California. The project is located in Sections 7 and 18, T04S, R03E, Humboldt Base and Meridian; in the Briceland U.S. Geological Survey 7.5-minute quadrangle; Assessor's Parcel Numbers 220-272-024 (stream diversion), 220-331-013 (pipeline crossing); latitude 40.1254 and longitude -123.9018 at the point of diversion (POD).

Project Description: The project is limited to 2 encroachments. One encroachment is for water diversion from an unnamed tributary to Miller Creek. Water is diverted for municipal use. Work for the water diversion will include use and maintenance of the water diversion infrastructure. The other proposed encroachment is to replace an existing pipeline crossing. Work for this encroachment will include excavation, removal of the existing pipeline and concrete abutments, replacement with new concrete abutments and pipeline, and rock armoring as necessary to minimize erosion.
