DESCRIPTION OF THE NATURE AND PURPOSE OF PROJECT: Plant up to one hundred and fifty-two (152) plants including trees and shrubs at Black Miners Bar within Folsom Lake State Recreation Area as part of an earth day planting project. Plant selection may include valley oak (Quercus lobata), blue oak (Quercus douglasii), interior live oak (Quercus wislizenii), ponderosa pine (Pinus ponderosa), gray pine (Pinus sabiniana), western redbud (Cercis occidentalis), California buckeye (Aesculus californica), coyote brush (Baccharis pilularis), and golden sticky monkey flower (Diplacus aurantiacus). Heavy equipment and hand tools will be used to:

- Remove and chip two (2) standing dead trees and two (2) fallen trees, chips will be utilized as mulch on site:
- Remove and pretreat invasive species within the project area;
- Dig up to one hundred and fifty-two (152) flat-bottomed holes, three (3) times the width and approximate depth to accommodate the root ball (not to exceed 28 inch wide by 28 inch deep); and
- Plant up to one hundred and fifty-two (152) plants of varying species.
