Project Description

California High-Speed Rail Authority proposes to provide immediate emergency response to flooding near Authority construction or near locations where Authority construction equipment is staged in Tulare County, California.

Emergency response actions including:

- 1. dewatering, diversion of flood waters;
- 2. levee construction, demolition, and/or repair; and
- 3. emergency road construction and repair

Repair activities:

- 1. Earth moving/grading to manage flood waters
- 2. Revegetation
- 3. Placement or replacement of materials
- 4. Access and staging for repair work

The purpose of this project is to repair and restore property and facilities damaged or destroyed due to recent flooding in Tulare County, where such actions are necessary to repair damage resulting from a disaster for a which a state of emergency has been proclaimed by the Governor, where such actions are necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, where such repairs are necessary to maintain service essential to public health, safety or welfare, or where such action is entirely within an existing highway right of way. This project does not include actions excluded by provisions in 14 CCR 15269. This project is needed to prevent the loss or impairment of life and/or essential public services.

Other General Conditions of this Determination:

For an activity to qualify for this exemption, Environmental Services must approve a written description of the activity [to include, at minimum, the activity's exact location (cross-streets or lat/long coordinates) and boundaries (on a map/aerial photo), its size (mileage/acreage), its scope (nature of activity), and its duration] as consistent with the applicable CEQA criteria and as necessary to the state's emergency response and repair efforts.
