On June 8, 2022, the County placed a newspaper ad on the Modesto Bee to inform the public that an in-person public meeting was scheduled for 5:30 p.m. on June 15, 2022 at the Beard Park Pavilion. The purpose of the public meeting was to inform the community of the project. The public meeting held was an open-house style, with information for the project on storyboards set up on easels around the pavilion. The storyboards included information about the purpose of the project, plan and elevation views of the proposed bridge and roadway improvements, description of project features, proposed detour routes, and a summary of the project completion timeline. Two members of the public attended the meeting and no comments or concerns were received. There is no known area of controversy.
