BR-1 addresses the Biological resources it states Prior to the recordation of the final map the following areas shall be delineated on the parcel map as non-buildable: The Floodplain Boundary per current FEMA map and that Prior to the recordation of the final map the wetland area shall be identified on the parcel map and the wetland shall be designated as non-buildable on the parcel map. CR-1 addresses Cultural Resources it states in part that; If archaeological resources or human remains are accidentally discovered on the project site during construction, work shall be halted by the construction manager within 50 meters (150 feet) of the find until it can be evaluated by a qualified professional archaeologist. If the find is determined to be significant, appropriate mitigation measures shall be formulated and implemented. CR-2 further addresses cultural resources it states in part that; If human remains are found at any time on the project site, work must be stopped by the construction manager, and the County Coroner must be notified immediately. If the Coroner determines that the remains are Native American, the Native American Heritage Commission will be notified as required by law. The Commission will designate a Most Likely Descendant who will be authorized to provide recommendations for management of the Native American human remains. Mitigation GEO-1 addresses geological and soils concerns by requiring erosion control meausre and BMP recommendations for the time during potential future contruction. TCR-1 Native American Cultural resources ground disturbance., TCR-2 non-buildable areas to protect Tribal Resources, and TCR-3 Tribe request of protected area.
